From the Kitchen: Tofu Vegetable Soup!

It's a soy sauce based soup with tofu and carrot. Carrots are sliced thinly, so this soup is quick to make. **Yield:** 4 servings

Ingredients:

- 3 cup dashi soup
- 1 carrot, peeled and thinly sliced into rectangles
- 8 shiitake mushrooms, thinly sliced
- 1/2 block tofu, cut into small blocks
- 1 Tbsp mirin
- 1 Tbsp soy sauce
- 1 tsp salt

Preparation:

1. Put dashi in a medium pan and bring to a boil on high heat.
2. Add carrots and shiitake in the soup. Turn the heat to medium.
3. Simmer until carrots are softened.
4. Season with sake, mirin, soy sauce, and salt and bring to a boil.
5. Add tofu in the soup.
6. Stop the heat when tofu is cooked.

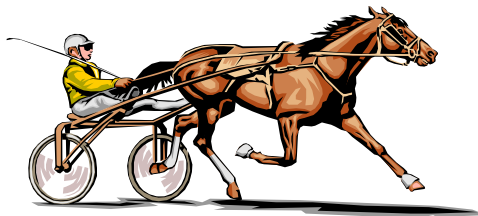


The far left is Kristin Kawamoto, Janis Kawamoto is left of the driver, and Maureen Parker (the girl's aunt) is right of the driver.
